THE DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE SEVEN

Thou didst shatter death by Thy Cross, Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment-bearing women into joy. And didst bid Thine Apostles proclaim a warning, that Thou hast risen O Christ, granting to the world the Great Mercy.

APOLYTIKION OF ST STEPHEN THE ARCHDEACON IN TONE FOUR

The crown of the Kingdom hath adorned the brow of thy head * because of the contests that thou hast endured for Christ God, thou first of the martyred Saints; * for when thou hadst censured the Jews' madness, thou sawest * Christ thy Savior standing at the right hand of the Father. * O Stephen, ever pray Him for us, that He would save our souls.

Now sing the apolytikion of the patron saint.

KONTAKION OF THE TRANSFIGURATION TONE SEVEN

Thou wast transfigured on the mount, and Thy Disciples, in so far as they were able, beheld Thy glory, O Christ our God; so that, when they should see Thee crucified, they would remember that all Thy suffering was voluntary, and could declare to all the world that Thou art truly the effulgent Splendor of the Father.

EPISTLE:

The Lord will give strength to His people.

Bring to the Lord, O sons of God, bring to the Lord honor and glory.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians. (1:10-17)

Brethren, I appeal to you, by the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no dissension among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brethren. What I mean is that each one of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispos and Gaius; lest anyone should say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas. Beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the Gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

GOSPEL:

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (14:14-22)

At that time, when Jesus went ashore he saw a great throng; and he had compassion on them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to Him and said, "This is a lonely place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They said to Him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish." And He said, "Bring them here to Me." Then He ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass; and taking the five loaves and the two fish He looked up to Heaven, and blessed, and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Then Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He dismissed the crowds.

UPDATED ANNOUNCEMENT CONCERNING CHURCH SERVICES, ETC.

Governor Waltz issued a new Emergency Executive Order regarding the use of face masks in Church. From now until we hear otherwise, Face Masks shall be used in Church. Please refer to the Update, I sent out on Friday, July 24 for more information.

With the new directives from Metropolitan Joseph and the Emergency Executive Order 20-62 of Governor Waltz, we have been allowed to increase the number of people attending Divine Services to 25% of capacity with people **practicing social distancing!** Please go online to <https://www.sig-nupgenius.com/go/30E0444A8AC23ABF85-stgeorge> to sign up for the Services. We have 50 slots

available for each Service. **PLEASE DO NOT SIGN UP FOR TWO SUNDAYS IN A ROW.** We must let people come back to the Church. Look on the signup sheet **early on Sunday morning** and if there is room, then you can sign up again. The Services continue to be available via **Livestreaming** on YouTube thanks to the efforts of Heath Nelson, Mike Varian and James Baker!

We have been given the permission to distribute Holy Communion and hear Confessions **by appointment.** Those who might be afraid to come back to Church in a larger setting can sign up to receive Holy Communion after all Services. We hope soon to be able to start doing more things at Church but until we hear differently **we are still not having meetings or using the facilities for any reason.** Try to do everything from home, by phone or email. 3. From your online bank account, schedule Bill Pay and a paper check will be written to the church.
4. A paper check can be written and mailed to the church.

5. When you come to Church, the collection tray will not be passed. Please leave your offering in the plate on the Candle Table before or after Services.

Clothes Closet: Operating on an appointment basis. Need on site volunteers who are willing and able to meet face to face (with masks) with clients. We are only accepting donations of winter wear for men, women and children including coats, boots, hats, scarves, gloves and mittens.

Reception: We are in need of a few volunteers who are willing to be receptionist for the building. This means you will answer the phone and take messages, let people into the building and direct them to where they need to go, answer questions about our programming, and perhaps make inquiries for us or confirm clothes closet appointments. In general, hours will be 10-2:00. This can be divided between two different people, can be split 10:00-12:30 and 12:30-2:30

Food Shelf: operating on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month. Occasional help is needed stocking shelves, filling bags of staples for distribution, dividing large quantities into smaller bags for distribution/picking up food.

Bagged Lunch/Sandwiches: Approximately 200 bagged lunches made weekly for various youth partners and for neighborhood distribution. Production of the sandwich/lunch bags occurs Thursdays from 10:00 - 12:00 and distributed Mondays and Thursdays from 11:30-12:30 outside FOCUS House Volunteers are needed to make sandwiches, pack bags, and distribute /deliver the lunches.

Sunday Dinners: Served from 5-7pm Sunday evenings as to-go meals. Groups have signed up to prepare and bring the meal for most Sundays between now and Christmas.
